

The conference has brought together people of different professions and background. The lecturers paleoarchaeologist, foresters, ecologists, botanists and lawyers – presented their views to students, teachers, scientists, and nature conservationists who deal with ecological education.

As a follow-up to the conference a publication is being prepared to bring the new findings about the historical forms of exploitation of forest stands, as well as questions about the priorities of conservation of the forest ecosystems taking into account their non-production functions.
