RCES are networks of local or regional institutions working together to promote all types and levels of learning for a sustainable future. The RCE concept is the brainchild of the United Nations University created to overcome the difficulty of reaching international consensus on the nature and scope of ESD. An RCE is primarily a means of encouraging dialogue among diverse parties to share information and experience and to seek ways of promoting inter-disciplinary and multi-sectoral collaboration for ESD. The normally include universities, NGOs, regional and municipal governments, schools, museums, etc. The seminar will be addressed by leading European experts on ESD and representatives of existing European RCEs.
